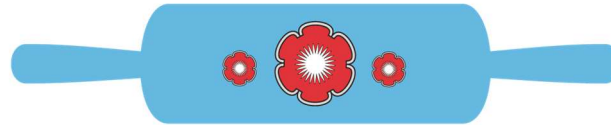

 - **Baker Arrival Date and Time:** Friday, December 19, 2025, 5:00–5:45 PM
 - **Judging Begins:** 6:00 PM
 - **Announcement of Winners:** 8:00 PM

Important Notes

- Maximum of 10 participants in each category on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Kolachi must be presented at room temperature.
- Bakers must be present during judging at 6:00 PM and announcement of winners at 8:00 PM.
- Each baker will receive one (1) complimentary ticket to the Home for the SLAVIdays event. Any additional individuals accompanying the baker will pay for admission to the event at the door.
- One (1) whole roll is sufficient for judging. If bakers wish to share their remaining kolachi with family, friends, and attendees after judging concludes, they should bring their own plates/napkins, as Penguin City does not have a kitchen.
- Rolls should remain whole until time to judge. Since Penguin City does not have a kitchen, bakers are encouraged to bring their own knives to cut pieces for each of the three (3) judges.

Home for the SLAVIdays Kolachi Contest Official Rules

WHAT IS KOLACHI?

Kolachi is a traditional Slavic pastry made from sweet, yeast-leavened dough and typically filled with ingredients like poppy seeds, nuts, or fruit preserves. It is often enjoyed during holidays and special occasions and celebrated for its rich cultural and historical roots in Slavic heritage.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. Submit an entry form, a description of your kolachi and its Slavic roots (75 words or fewer), and a \$5 non-refundable entry fee (payable to Simply Slavic) by **Wednesday, December 17, 2025**.
 2. Limit: **One entry per participant in each category.**

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

- Open to non-professional bakers (those not paid to bake to make their living).
 - There are no restrictions on age, gender, or nationality.
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SUBMISSION DETAILS

- Deliver baked goods to **Penguin City Brewing Company (460 E Federal St, Youngstown, OH 44503)** on **Friday, December 19, 2025**, between **5:00 - 5:45 PM**.
 - Entries not present by judging time will forfeit participation.
 - Portions of each roll will be used for judging, and the remainder may be shared with family, friends, and attendees after judging concludes.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- Judging begins at **6 PM** on **December 19, 2025**.
 - Judges include professional bakers, community leaders, and business representatives.
 - Entries will be judged on the following criteria:
 - **Taste** – Flavor, balance, and overall enjoyment
 - **Authenticity** – Connection to Slavic traditions and historical roots
 - **Presentation** – Visual appeal, traditional swirl, and appearance
 - **Texture** – Consistency and structure of the baked good
 - **Look & Smell** – First impressions from appearance and aroma
 - The judges' decisions are final.

PRIZES

- **First, Second, and Third-place** winners will be announced at the Home for the SLAVIdays event on **Friday, December 19, 2025, at 8 PM**.
 - Simply Slavic reserves the right to substitute prizes of equal or greater value.

RESTRICTIONS

- Entries must be presented at room temperature (no freezing, refrigeration, or heating allowed).
 - Participation is limited to 10 contestants in each category, accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
 - Contestants must remain at the event through the announcement of winners.

ADDITIONAL TERMS

- Simply Slavic is not responsible for errors, delays, or lost entries.
- Participants grant Simply Slavic permission to use their names, likenesses, and submissions for promotional purposes by entering.
- All baked goods become the property of Simply Slavic and will not be returned.
- Simply Slavic reserves the right to modify, cancel, or disqualify entries that do not comply with these rules.

RELEASE

By participating, entrants agree to release Simply Slavic, its sponsors, volunteers, and affiliates from any liability related to participation, prizes, or the contest process.
